During the past 4 1/2 years as a disciple of Bhagwan Shree Rajneesh I've been mostly connected with the Sanups-activities like Amitabh, the Rajneesh Meditation Center in Amsterdam, the ashram in Poona, India and since ± 1 1/2 year I live in this ashram in Amsterdam, together with ± 55 other sanupasins, as part of "De Stad Rajneesh" Commune in Holland.

Bhagwan's tremendous love is reflected in the work, the dance we dance, the walls we build, the clothes I fold, the contacts we make. He is guiding me in the process of inner growth, encouraging to look at myself in all my different moods, to become aware of all my created barriers that stop me from opening up to myself, to others, to life. And the commune supports, as we're all on the same "track". A Buddhafield is created far away from the physical presence of our Master.

Last July to be in Rajneeshpuram at the Second Annual world celebration was such a beautifull experience : to be together with 15.000 people and sit silently at the feet of our Master ; such precious moments of love, turning inside and celebration!

Slowly I become more aware of Bhagwan's message to share love and care for each other and the things around us, starting from inside to let real freedom happen and celebrate life.

No words are needed, truth cannot be spoken, it has its own language in silence.
